



Hot Topics in Minnesota’s Commercial Tobacco Control Laws

Local Minnesota communities are at the forefront of commercial tobacco control strategies. Attendees will learn about the history of commercial tobacco control policy and the basic legal framework for popular local public policies, including: restrictions on the sale of flavored tobacco products, raising the minimum legal sales age, and comprehensive regulation of emerging products that you may have seen in the news, like JUUL.
