Proclamation

WHEREAS: Minnesota's local and state public health workers protect and improve the health ofpeople across

the state, working to make our communities great places to live, work, and play; and

WHEREAS: Public health workers play a key role in supporting good health and greater longevity for

Minnesotans by promoting healthy behaviors, improving the health of mothers and children, monitoring and responding to infectious disease threats, and identifying and mitigating

environmental health hazards; and

WHEREAS: In recent months, public health workers have endured historic challenges from ongoing COVID-19

transmission, early and severe influenza and RSV seasons, as well as overlapping outbreaks of

mpox (monkeypox) and measles; and

WHEREAS: State, local, and tribal public health workers work tirelessly to keep communities safe from disease

outbreaks, environmental contamination, and other potential causes of disease and suffering, and to share information to help people access resources and make effective decisions to protect and

improve the health; and

WHEREAS: The public health community works to advance health equity by improving the health of those

experiencing disparities including people of color, American Indians, Minnesota's rural

communities, immigrants and refugees, and the LGBTQ+ community; and

WHEREAS: Minnesota's public health professionals are constantly developing new strategies to detect and

control disease outbreaks, address emerging environmental contaminants, communicate valuable information about health care costs and quality, prepare for large-scale emergencies, and promote

healthy communities.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, TIM WALZ, Governor of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of April 3-9, 2023, as:

PUBLIC HEALTH WEEK

in the State of Minnesota.
